Greg Morrow is the Executive Director of the Fred Sands Institute of Real Estate at Pepperdine University's Graziadio School of Business and Management, where he also serves as Academic Director of the Master of Science in Real Estate (MSRE) program and the Fred Sands Executive Professor of Real Estate.

Morrow comes to Pepperdine from the University of Calgary, where he was the Richard Parker Professor of Metropolitan Growth and Change, a joint appointment in the Haskayne School of Business and Faculty of Environmental Design. His research on metropolitan growth and change has explored a range of urban planning and real estate issues facing North American cities, including the impact of restrictive zoning on housing supply and affordability, innovative funding mechanisms to finance local area improvements, and the impacts of transit-oriented development.

Dr. Morrow earned his PhD in Urban Planning from UCLA, and was previously a faculty member at MIT, where he had completed master's degrees in city planning and urban design. He has also served on the faculty at Occidental College's Urban and Environmental Policy program, was a fellow in the UCLA Institute of the Environment and Sustainability, and served on the Calgary Planning Commission.
